- The work I do gives me the opportunity to see the tremendous collaboration among so many organizations, agencies, and companies. The pandemic has really called forth the goodness of people in this county. Because so many can rally together in the short term to work toward the survival of those most in need, we should be able to consistently work toward systemic changes resulting in respect for all and a sense of belonging and contribution by every person.

I can not understand that and it speaks to the racism that is here on this native american ground that is also on a reservation. it seems that there is little work being done as a community to live together with Oneida people. They are treated poorly by our local government bodies. I am very disappointed about the racism here. There could be more done to embrace the diversity that just adds to wonderful cultural experience of brown county. I am also very concerned about the environment. The air and water are very polluted and I think we need to do more to clean up. more to stop the pollution of the great lakes and our beautiful streams, creeks, and rivers. I am also very worried about the soil and all the industrial agriculture and urban pesticides that are applied that entering our streams and water and our food supply. concern about the economic future of our small family farms and the loss of those farms that will change the landscape of our state. Concerned about FLOODING. all the trees being cut down.
- My life would be improved if cars would watch for pedestrians before coming into crosswalks; trains would be discouraged from rush hour operation; coal piles moved; people engaged in more non-drinking related activities; aggressive drivers were punished and therefore discouraged from continuously tailgating and speeding; the Fox River Trail was intact at Adams and Mason/Cass Street; groceries were available in downtown Green Bay; and mentally ill people walking around could get help, especially those who yell at/threaten pedestrians.

- I have lived here for 25+ years and have seen great changes but see storm clouds on the horizon. 25 years later I am still an outsider. Brown County is too parochial. Brown County needs to embrace the fact that it is no longer a white Catholic (I am both) community and embrace diversity of all types (race, gender and ethnicity), otherwise we will become even more divided and social issues will fester and worsen. The pandemic has shown us the class divide and how poorer members of our community suffered more from job, food, internet and mental health insecurity. We can and must do better.
- Change the taxes it's killing me!
- Open up and let everyone get back to work !!
- Rent is out of control, and causing unnecessary hardships if you want to live in a safe place
- Brown County has a variety of living situations. Based on the questions, I can tell you that there are most certainly areas of Green Bay and Brown County that I would never live in, nor would I feel safe in or around. I know we're nowhere near Milwaukee or Chicago's inner-city high crime areas, but the amount of gang/illegal activity has seemed like it's on the rise. I'm disappointed to hear or read about the random shootings in the area, it really seems to have ramped up in the last two years. I think the Green Bay area has come a long way in the last 15-20 years, but along with that development has come a rise in property values, and cost of living in the area (more than they're actually worth). As much as my family does not suffer or struggle with this, we do see a majority of families and households struggle in the cycle of poverty, unsafe living conditions, and reliance on government assistance. I also think that some of the pre-defined answers to questions may not give you an accurate depiction of the area. For instance, if someone is partially dissatisfied or very dissatisfied, there is no in-between... they're all dissatisfied. Some of the pre-definitions did not include "does not apply to me." I think the U.S. Census results might provide a better perspective of the economic status of Brown County.

- NEED TO KEEP A STRONG ECONOMY IN ORDER TO CONTINUE TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF LIFE. GET PEOPLE TO WORK THAT ARE COLLECTING UNEMPLOYMENT.
- I think Brown County provides a great quality of life, but think we are becoming more isolated and this has become exacerbated by COVID-19. I think Green Bay Neighborhoods could play a huge role in helping engagement by encouraging neighborhood events, getting to know your neighbor, and creating a culture where being involved in your neighborhood is part of life.
- I think it is a great place to live.
- Just to stress to be more environmentally friendly and start implementing environmentally friendly tactics, technology, and ways of life. Clean up water ways and water fronts.
- Life in my demographic is fine, but minorities and lower income folks have many areas of life that need to improve. Not sure how or what as I am not in that demographic
- I believe this area has so much potential (good people, smart people, natural amenities, economic opportunities) but worry about the rate of progress. We have some diversity in terms of our community population but we haven't achieved equity because major quality of life indicators are still very different depending on race and gender (median income, rent or own/housing quality, education, health outcomes, crime, etc. are all more favorable for white people and particularly white males). We can figure this out and work together to make things better for all!!
- To respond to all of Brown County is difficult. I tended to think about Green Bay. The education questions when we have multiple school districts will be difficult to decipher as i thinks so districts are doing great and others - not so much.
- I would like to park my car next to the river to walk the sidewalk, but there seems to be no free parking.
- I would like to see more diversity in Brown Counties elected officials, employees and staff.
- I would love to see the county actively diversify all county positions, especially the county board, law enforcement, teachers, healthcare workers, local government.
- Brown County needs to look to the South at the Fox Valley. The school districts, the recreational activities, the job opportunities and the housing in the Fox Valley are far superior that what is in Brown County. If my husband or I lose our jobs, we will be looking in the Fox Valley because there doesn't seem to the opportunity for one to be very sustainable in Brown County.
- I think Brown County has a lot of potential. Overall, this is a decent community to live in, but if changes aren't made in the next five years to address racism, income inequality, affordable housing, accessibility, pollution, and lack of multicultural community events, I will be leaving.

- Need to address RACISM as well.
- It is a very generous community, however, a lot of people are still being left behind. But this is an issue which extends beyond our community - it is a national problem.
- I would like to experience more diversity. A better job market with better paying jobs.
- I love living here, I want all of the residents to enjoy the benefits that I have experienced here. We need to continue to take care of others, especially children and youth of our community. We need to overcome fear of the unknown with those of other races, cultures and other differences.
- We need more street lights on residential streets from Lombardi/ homegrain way to 9th street. It's too dark to walk safely outside at night. This goes for most neighborhoods on the east and west side of Green Bay.
- Brown County's leadership is stuck in outdated notions of what the County is and who it is for. The County's governing forces continue to neglect public resources, allow the egregious income gap between the City of Green Bay and the suburbs to continue growing, and allowing the bigoted and closed-minded attitudes of outspoken residents create a community that is hostile to anyone different than the stereotypical resident of Brown County. No one I know under the age of 30 who lives here lives here happily; we all aspire to move out of Brown County or are actively trying to move elsewhere. This is in large part because of the lack of social services, culture, and career opportunities outside of healthcare/banking/manufacturing. There is also a dearth of social opportunities for anyone who is young and childless, particularly if you are single, and the inability to do any social activities without drinking is frustrating.
- We live here because of family. The question about retiring here was thought-provoking--would I choose this as a destination to retire, no. But it is a good place to live here in retirement? Yes. I still work (self-employed), but we're at a point where we could have choices, if not for family. Low marks for support of the arts, although I know many people are working hard to make the arts more relevant. The loss of our Symphony Orchestra and the Weidner Center programming was demoralizing and, to me, exemplifies the challenges a football-based economy and culture poses. Our kids attending Aldo Leopold and East H.S. and I was very pleased with their public education (and public education in general.) I think schools face funding challenges now, but teachers are still working hard with less and less resources. I am ashamed of certain obstructionist county supervisors that are more about theatrics than working for the greater good of our community. We won't move forward with a bunch of angry white men allowed to shape policy.
- The quality of life is improving in Brown County but there is still much to do. The fallout from COVID is going to result in more homelessness and housing costs are continuing to rise. We need more safe, clean low-income housing opportunities. We also need to have more mental health services and increase the number of mental health first responders so armed police officers do not need to respond to those sorts of calls.

- Overall, I love living here. It's safe. There's natural areas (though I always wish there were even more), and I love things like the farmer's market and public library.
- My husband and I are not from Green Bay. We lived here for awhile, moved away but missed Green Bay so we moved back. Since our return, which has been a little over a year, we have been immensely disappointed in the governing officials, school board and Health dept. It appears laziness has set in and the quality of work put forth is minimal when it comes to the people of the county. Much needed services have ceased and appear will not return. Low income and no income residents are not being tended to.
- I think there is great awareness and desire to make Brown County a great place to live. We have supporting programs and efforts for many things and that is good. I believe there is a strong willingness among the people who CAN afford to support these efforts either with time or money.
- I think that Green Bay has lots of potential to be a great community. There seems to be a lot of negative emotions about those that have lost their jobs or are struggling financially, calling them lazy or saying they are trying to cheat the system for "free" money, which I do not personally agree with. I think if the community would work together, the quality of life would be better. Plus, I do think we need more services to help those who are struggling and we need much more affordable housing so that people do not have to choose between paying their rent and eating.

As a woman, I'm already making less than my male counterparts, and once I have to start paying for childcare, I will be taking home less than minimum wage. I have a masters degree and spent a lot of time and money on my education. The thought that I may not be able to continue working for a fair wage after childcare is incredibly disheartening. I would be curious to learn more about the disparities between men and women (and minorities) in the workplace in our area and how we can change this pay and employment gap.
- We witness a lot of de facto segregation across brown county, especially within the city limits of Green Bay. I would love for work to be done around that and the issue of how we fund our school systems to be addressed. Clearly with de facto segregation comes inequitable public schools and a ghetto-ing of schools that serve populations who are already struggling financially. When I do see local art featured in the news it's usually a story about someone who is obviously quite privileged and the subject matter is almost always nature, which is beautiful but we could be expanding things or showcasing a new take on natural spaces. Years back when I would see for instance, metal sculptures pop up it was refreshing. Virtual learning was a connectivity nightmare in my house, Brown County could really stand to expand on internet connectivity and Cell tower technology. It's 2021 and I get patchy internet and cellphone service in a locale immediately adjacent to the city. We really need

network and community"...those of us who want to add to the culture here with our talents, viewpoints, and lived experiences....had better not appear to challenge the well established "it's a great place to raise a family" narrative. You want talent to move to this region - yet where is the quality affordable childcare? Where is the support when this talent is telling you they don't feel welcomed or included for who they are? How are we training c-suite leaders to not just attract D&I talent - BUT ALSO build the cultural org. infrastructure to sustain it. COVID19 has dramatically impacted women in the workplace as we have added home schooling while working full time jobs to already full plates. There is plenty of economic data to show that women who were forced to leave the workplace to care for children will have a dramatic long-tale negative effect both on the financial stability of families in our region as well as the economic health to our region - and YET - this isn't being addressed. Teach workplaces how to adapt.

- If housing & childcare issues were addressed, other challenges like mental health concerns, food security, AODA issues, etc. would fall into place. - Because of events of the last few weeks, we are being asked to call into question the results of last year's election. If we cannot trust local officials to do the right thing so that every vote is counted properly, we are headed in the wrong direction. To be clear, I personally don't think the election was compromised.

- After living here for five years in the most progressive neighborhood, my wife and I have decided to transfer to another state. As a gay married non-religious couple it was near impossible to find community. We made multiple attempts to connect via neighborhood/politics/volunteerism. The healthcare community had little to no cultural competency working with LGBT folks. The final decision was made after seeing how the community responded to George Floyd's murder COVID-19. It was night and day compared to when we would go to Madison. The data showed via positivity rate that this community refused to follow basic public health guidance, resulting in my family not feeling safe living here. I was happy to see some progress with the election of the new mayor and I applaud all of the grass roots groups working toward justice and equity. I know that I have a level of privilege based on my SES to move to a more progressive city. We decided that this community and the lack of social capital was hurting our emotional and physical health. We also made the decision that if we wanted to be parents we would never raise kids in a same sex couple in this community. It would be unfair to the kids and us as parents. I wish Brown County all the best in their efforts to make the community a more welcoming place for diverse community members.
- With the major influx of people from larger cities, we need to be careful the safety of our citizens continues as it has in the past.
- Overall, the Brown County area has a lot to offer and is a great place to live!
- Internet service/choices are horrible in southern Brown county . Even having difficulty completing this survey.
- I graduated, left and many years later am back. Green Bay is better than when I left, but for a city of this size we're behind on the vibrant community part. There isn't much that makes us "attractive" to visitors. Weedy, pavement and run down come to mind. People want greenery, walkability, niche shops and restaurants. We're not very attractive to those types of businesses yet.
- we need to prioritize how people of color are treated in our community. Landlords & realtors discriminate, white people are fragile, and we want to attract young people/families, we need to prioritize how we treat everyone.
- Overall we love living in Green Bay and love our downtown.
- Overall, I enjoy this community and believe many of the discussions and changes are moving us in the right direction.
- We have to move beyond systemic racism and accept the fact that based on demographics our community will be Very multicultural within 20 to 30 years. Local

multigenerational families will be very threatened by this development and may cause serious fractures in our community.

- My family and teen children are mix raced. We have experience blatant racism from police, firemen, teachers, and others. We still respect them and their important roles and abide by the rules. We need to do better. Our teens need free things to do in the city. Our families need more help with mental illness services. Those of us above the threshold for most assistance but still barely able to meet our bills need more assistance to reduce student debt, buy houses for our families (stop renting), and send our kids to college. My kids are in fine arts programs and deserve to be home owners college graduates and stay here in green bay to become what we need more of, good, honest, hard workers that can contribute to our economy. Bring free safe places for them to spend time. Places for them to express, gather, grow. An arts center outside downtown where anyone can sign up to have a stage for poetry, music, performance. Have kids paint along walking paths (interactive). Have a program where ppl can earn transportation fare or \$ toward a vehicle for after high school by volunteering and attending finance and vehicle care classes. Hire more ethnic ppl as police/fire/judges/city officials and clergy.
- It has come a long way since I was a kid, but it still has a ways to go! I think Diversity and events and activities are key!
- Overall I feel this is a very safe and welcoming community and is an excellent place to raise a family

- there is so much growth of things to do or places to go (or places to live, for that matter) for those on the higher end of the economic scale, but little to nothing for those on the lower end. guess there's no incentive (\$) to have things for those who can't or don't want to pay a ton for everything. even the little camping that's available is overpriced, & really not that nice (tent sites crammed together with little to no separation, at \$20/night!). also the whole dental/health thing here is pretty horrid, starting from all the professionals in the area who couldn't care less about the uninsured, underinsured, or on the lower economic scale. not everyone who is poor has medicaid!
- Brown County has never address the racism or negative view of diversity from the last LIFE studies. There was a missed opportunities to inform nonprofit, businesses and

education organizations about this. Quality of life has to be inclusive. Many Brown County efforts are based on majority votes and/or voices and underrepresented populations will never be 'enough' in numbers to move efforts.

- We do not feel safe here anymore - it's getting violent!!!!!!!
- It is a good place to live, more work should be put into social programs. Social programs cost the people less money in the end. Ex: when children have high quality childcare, as adults; they are less likely to be incarcerated, and have better overall physical health.
- We moved to Brown County from La Crosse County last November. Realizing it is a bigger population, one thing that surprised me though the rudeness of drivers and blatant disregard for neighborhood safety with driving. People don't stop at stop signs, they speed through our neighborhood (MacArthur Heights), etc. With no sidewalks, it feels unsafe walking your dogs or our granddaughter in a stroller. I do like the beautiful parks and dog parks, and will continue to explore the city as the weather warms, but it is hard to feel connected to people in this city - everyone seems rude and in a hurry.
- I am astounded by the level of caring in this community among activists, but their efforts need to be better funded.
- Life in Brown County is definitely easier than living in a large city. However, as a transplant, feeling settled in this area takes at least 3-5 years. Typically, I learn about a new city through my own explorations and the people I meet. After a year, I feel pretty settled. Here, because meeting people and feeling connected are so difficult, it's taken a lot longer.
- City of Green Bay property taxes are extremely high in comparison to other Brown County municipalities which is very frustrating. I'm not convinced that as a Green Bay resident, I'm getting what I'm paying for.
- I think the quality of life varies greatly in Brown County based on your income, and on the location you live in.
- Quality of life in Brown County varies on which part you live in.
- The quality of water in Suamico really needs to be addressed. It is left to the residents to deal with where other communities in Brown County all are on city water.
- BC has not been a friendly place for Latinos/Hispanics. I was born in the US, but often treated as fresh immigrant. I often wondered if I was just the token Hispanic to meet EEOC requirements; which made me work twice as hard for far less recognition, advancement opportunities. Mostly felt that my role was to show up, work, don't give an opinion, don't try to shine. Often the victim of targeted mistreatment by management and some coworkers. Political affiliation as a protected class in this state has only given a platform for workplace bullying and creation of hostile work environments. I've found purpose and a sense of protection being involved in cultural organizations and learning my rights.
- Moved up here from Chicago-love this area
- I've enjoyed living in the Green Bay area for twenty two years now. It is still a great area to live in but the quality of life is ebbing in the wrong direction. I hope that our

community leaders are aware of this and can take steps to make sure we become and even more attractive place to live and work.

- Some of these questions don't relate well to Brown County as a whole. I believe the education in the outlying districts, East/West De Pere, Wrightstown, Howard, etc. is great, while the education in the Green Bay system is not. I believe safety in parks and neighborhoods in the outlying districts is good, while in Green Bay, particularly on the East Side is not. The answers to most of these questions depends on where in the county you live. West De Pere is an excellent place to live. One thing to improve would be to create an app for the bus system like Chicago uses. One of our children lives there and uses the bus system regularly. She finds the bus system in Green Bay to be greatly lacking in comparison. The answers to your questions about employment also don't take age into consideration, i.e., how easily could I find a new job in my career if I were to lose my current one. For someone aged 50+, it would be very difficult. My husband has been laid up with foot issues multiple times in the last 7 years, and getting around in this area via wheelchair, scooter, etc. is very difficult. Cracks/uneven sidewalks make things very difficult, lack of handicapped parking, buildings without automatic doors, no elevators, lack of recreational opportunities for mobility-challenged people are too numerous to elaborate on here. Overall, Brown County is a good place to live, but changes are needed. Also, the Green Bay Mayor's very Democratic rants on social media really make the City of Green Bay look bad.

I'm not saying this was caused by that but I noticed the large hispanic population moving in because at the time I was living at the Belleuve Trailer Court, which had been mostly "white" people. Within 1 year I had hispanic families living next door to me, in back of me and numerous on the same road. I got along great with all of them. The hispanic or actually, mexican women behind me would trade plants and seeds with me and we'd plant together. We didn't speak at all the same language but we still got along good. - Brown County really needs to become serious about reducing its carbon footprint and creating a long term plan to mitigate the threats of climate change. In 2019 I was in the flooding evacuation zone during the March flood. That was not the first time I was adversely affected by flooding either. The county needs to not only invest in emergency services/preparedness, but needs to create and retain green infrastructure to handle increased flooding over the next several decades. The county committing to 100 percent clean energy for its operations was a good first step in addressing climate change. Now we need to make real investments and provide incentives for homeowners to purchase solar panels or other forms of renewable energy. We can increase the quality of life by saving residents (renters and property owners) money on their energy bills, reducing carbon dioxide and methane pollution, and creating jobs through clean energy capital improvement projects. Also, per- and polyflouroalkyl substances (PFAS) have become a crisis in Wisconsin. In Marinette and Peshtigo, fire fighting foam containing the toxic substance has made it into groundwater and the Bay. Brown County will almost certainly be affected by that contamination, but we also have plenty of industry based here that can and has already released PFAS chemicals. Georgia-Pacific recently tested their monitoring wells and found PFAS levels higher than the DHS recommended standard. We need to be proactive in testing for these chemicals and holding polluters accountable for their remediation.

- It is great living here- there are steps we can take to involve and market the area and what it has to offer.
- Brown County is a very easy place to live if you are white. In my opinion, that is because it does not expect much from its residents and because the cost of living here is very low. I think the County would reap the benefits in countless ways if it made itself more open to people of different cultures.
- I feel this is a pretty middle white American dominated county that does not recognize the wonderful diversity in our county—we should be making an effort to know our neighbors (native Americans, Hmong, Hispanics, Blacks, etc.), more than we do. I also feel the gap is made wider by the widening disparity in housing available in the county—example the expensive housing being built around Lambeau field. Life is good for me as a recently retired middle class white woman, but I am not so sure that is the case for other women of other races and not so lucky life journeys as mine.
- Brown County as a whole, has a lot to offer. It's Green Bay that is the problem. The Mayor is not doing his job. Inadvertently it affects the surrounding areas, by what the Mayor, Health service, Community/Council members do, vote on or decide. Somehow it ends up applying to the rest of us. Who we, as non GB residents don't even have a choice to vote for a new Mayor, HS, or Council members. All villages/townships/cities should be held accountable for their own spending/funding. Green Bay is not being held accountable and that sets the stage for all surrounding areas. GBPD Chief should be

doing his job with the department while in uniform, not walking with BLM OR ANY other Peaceful protests, unless he is in non uniform. ALL of the BC Sheriff's Department's and other surrounding PD's have been excellent in doing what their job requires of them and NOT pandering to "protests". Lastly, if you do a crime, do the time if found guilty. There is a time and place for rehabilitation vs jail/prison. That has been lost in our judicial system. Very disturbing to see 4th, 5th, 6th OWI or Repeat DV offenders. Repeated assault and battery offenders, ect. I see a lot of wasted money in this. Police arrest, DA charges, Judge gives a slap on the wrist, repeat. Especially on Felony charges. Get stronger from the start and you will not see as many repeat offenders.
